

GOLD_{vs} GREEN

AT A GLANCE

GOLD

The final published version of your article (or Version of Record) is permanently and freely available online for anyone, anywhere to read.

Not usually required.

An article publishing charge (APC) is usually applicable if you publish gold OA.

You, the author, retain copyright. The agreement includes the Creative Commons license of your choice. This dictates what others can do with your article once it's published.

Publish under a license with few or no restrictions on how people can reuse your work. Of course, they must still credit you if they do so.

GREEN

Also known as self-archiving, when you post an earlier version of your manuscript in repositories and online.

Usually required, unless publishing through an LIS journal.

You can share your article without having to pay an APC.

The copyright will usually sit with the publisher or affiliated society. Restrictions will apply to reuse.

You will need to check with the publisher. For Taylor & Francis journals, please see our recommendation for the license to use when sharing your Accepted Manuscript.
